RE: Approval of 2019/2020 2nd Interim Budget Report

We would like to thank you for your timely submission of the 2019/2020 2nd Interim report. Our office has completed its review in compliance with the provisions of Education Code 42131(a) (2). The Code requires the County Superintendent to approve or disapprove Interim Reports after:

Examining the report to determine whether it complies with the standards and criteria established pursuant to Section 33127.

Determining whether the adopted budget will allow the district to meet its financial obligations during the fiscal year and is consistent with a financial plan that will enable the district to satisfy its multi-year financial commitments.

Based on our review, the 2nd Interim Budget Report has been approved.

Additional changes, including attendance, new state programs, and the Governor's proposed 2020/2021 budget will be addressed as more solid information becomes available. A complete listing of any technical corrections and recommendations has been sent directly to the chief business official.

Multi-Year Projections

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Newsom's 2020/21 budget proposal provided a little relief with a proposed increase to serve students with disabilities; however, the budget provided little discretion for districts to expand locally. With a proposed COLA of 2.29%, down from the projection of 3% at Budget Adoption, districts would be struggling to cover the costs associated with step and column, minimum wage, STRS and PERS contributions and other increases to utilities and services based on the consumer price index. In our current situation with the COVID-19 pandemic, this brings much uncertainty to what the May Revise will look like as we will expect a 0% COLA in the proposal which would only exacerbate this situation. We continue to remind you that each LEA faces its own particular set of financial risk factors based on current reserve levels, enrollment trends, bargaining agreements, degree of revenue volatility and various other local and statewide factors. LEAs should plan for the aforementioned costs as we enter an economic downturn highly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cash Flow

The district is projecting adequate cash balances at June 30; however, it is important to closely monitor cash throughout the year to ensure that the actual cash balance at year end will be sufficient.

Deficit Spending

The district's budget reflects deficit spending in all three years of the unrestricted multi-year projection as follows; (\$65,562), (\$66,627) and (\$58,732). Years two and three include the current COLA proposal and may be greatly impacted by a possible reduction to 0%. We highly encourage the District to review the impact of a COLA decrease and have a contingency plan in place to mitigate the possible reduction of the LCFF revenue.

The attached trend analysis of the 2 interim budget to prior year actuals is provided for your assistance and will provide you with important comparative data for budgetary consideration. The comparative data will highlight trends in revenue and expenditure growth or decline, deficit spending patterns, and a final accounting for the ending fund balance.
